

## How to Use the Crossword Answer Glossary

Use the Crossword Answer Glossary for assistance in deciding which of the answers listed is correct. The 24,000+ answers in the alphabetical Glossary, located at the back of the book, include factual references and less common or tricky words. When you find an answer on the list that you're not familiar with, chances are there will be an entry for it in the Glossary.

For clarity, boldface Glossary words include punctuation if any (hyphens, apostrophes, etc.), and multiple-word answers have spaces between the words.

To help you find the Glossary, each page has a shaded band at the outer edge that is visible when the book is closed. And the top of each Glossary page is clearly labeled.
